

## 2026 ESSENTIALLY ELLINGTON STUDENT COMPOSITION/ARRANGING CONTEST

In the spirit of creativity and honoring our jazz legacy, we seek to encourage young musicians to compose and arrange by offering the *Essentially Ellington* Student Composition/Arranging Contest. Each submission will be critiqued by composer, arranger, and saxophonist, Ted Nash, and the winning selection will be announced along with the *Essentially Ellington* Competition & Festival finalist bands on the *EE* web page on Wednesday, January 28, 2026.

The winner will have their composition recorded by the Jazz at Lincoln Center Orchestra (JLCO) at their annual *Essentially Ellington* recording session. In addition, the winning composer will receive a \$1,000 cash prize, a composition lesson with Ted Nash, and a trip to New York City to observe the JLCO recording session and the *Essentially Ellington* Competition & Festival, April 30-May 2, 2026.

In writing their piece, students are to keep in mind the example of excellence set by Duke Ellington. Submissions must:

- Be under 5 minutes in length.
- Include a recording, which must be submitted electronically. While we encourage the submission of live
  recordings, we understand that this may not be possible for all of our applicants; therefore, midi files will
  be accepted. All submissions will be judged on their compositional merits, regardless of performance and
  recording quality.
- Include a full score, also to be submitted electronically via PDF. Please note that sketches will not be accepted. While various file types are accepted, Finale documents are preferred.
- Be scored for the instrumentation of the Jazz at Lincoln Center Orchestra: 2 alto saxes, 2 tenor saxes, bari sax, 3 trombones (or 2 trombones and bass trombone), 4 trumpets, piano, bass, guitar/banjo and drums. The following are acceptable doublings for each member of the reed section: alto 1 soprano sax, piccolo, flute, clarinet; alto 2 soprano sax, piccolo, flute, clarinet; tenor 1 soprano sax, flute, clarinet, Eb clarinet, bass clarinet; tenor 2 soprano sax, clarinet, bass clarinet; bari sax soprano sax, clarinet, bass clarinet. Note: alto flute may be added as a double to alto 1 & 2, and tenor 1.

In order to qualify you must be a high school student between the ages of 13–19 in the United States, Canada, or the U.S. Virgin Islands. Submissions are limited to one per student and must be submitted by 11:59PM EST on January 7, 2026 in order to be considered. Previous winners are not eligible for resubmission.
